



Stress that it's not an invasion of privacy and that the data is only going to be used to help distribute funds and with govt seat counts.

Please make an "I'm Counted" logo for people to share on social media to be a positive influence on getting others to be counted.

When will be getting our census form in the mail?

The census asked how many people were living at home on April 1, 2020. Because of COVID 19 my daughter, who was finishing her degree at the U of MN and living in Dinkytown, had moved home. The U of MN sent out notification that the students that had to move home due to COVID 19 should respond that they lived in Minneapolis on April 1, 2020 which she had done. So either the question should be changed or a notation to the answer should be included in the 2020 census data. The answer to the question is not reflective on the actual facts!
