The following pages list all of the volunteer opportunities available for summer teens enrolled in the Summer Teen Volunteer Program. Read the descriptions carefully and determine the activities, times and locations that will work best for you.

Remember, a volunteer must sign up for an entire session of activity, for example, an entire week of gymnastics camp, all three days of a Little Adventures camp or an entire week of a Park All Day program.

Volunteer shifts will typically begin 15 minutes before the programs' start time.

WHEN TO WORK SCHEDULING APP

The City of Plymouth uses the When to Work app to schedule front line staff members. It is a free app that is downloaded to a cell phone or other device. Summer Teen Volunteers assisting with most summer programs including playgrounds, aquatics, Plymouth Community Center and others will be scheduled using When to Work. The app can be used to print off weekly or monthly schedules and to communicate if the volunteer is unable to work a shift. Volunteers can also receive updates from their staff supervisors. Summer Teen Volunteers will be notified if they should download the app for their program.

Volunteers help set up and clean up, assist with the children's games and more.

The key to a successful interview starts and ends with YOU!

APPROPRIATE DRESS CODE

This is one aspect that is of great importance when attending an interview, as first impressions always count! Appropriate dress for the teenager is the same as any other person attending an interview – neat, tidy and well-groomed.

Some helpful tips are:

- Dress for success, in your most appropriate, professional outfit.
- Wear sensible shoes with moderate heels.
- Avoid extreme hairstyles.
- Keep make-up and perfume to a minimum.
- Avoid dangly or big earrings.
- Leave your hat or baseball cap at home.

PREPARE YOURSELF FOR THE INTERVIEW

Prepare well beforehand and know what you are going to say and how to conduct yourself in a professional manner. This can be achieved by practicing in front of a mirror or by role playing with friends or family members. Look on the internet for typical questions that interviewers ask and practice how you would answer them.

The more information you can prepare beforehand, the better prepared you will be during the interview. Take the time gather and go over any information that will be helpful to you.

ATTENDING THE INTERVIEW

Walk into the room showing a relaxed and confident manner, shake the hand of the interviewer and don't sit before asked. Remember not to slouch in your chair, swear or use slang words and always be polite.

AFTER THE INTERVIEW

A couple of days after the interview be sure to write a thank you letter to the interviewer, thanking them for giving you the interview. In this note, you could also reiterate any particular skills you have for the position and how you could make a positive addition to the group.

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Disclosure Regarding Background Checks

The City of Plymouth may conduct a background check on you to determine your eligibility for employment purposes (screening of applicants, employees, volunteers, or contractors), or it may obtain information about you from a third party consumer reporting agency for employment purposes. Thus, you may be the subject of a "consumer report" which may contain information regarding your credit history (if relevant to the position for which you are applying), criminal history, social security verification, motor vehicle records ("driving records"), verification of your education or employment history, or other background data.

You have the right, upon written request made within a reasonable time frame, to know whether a consumer report has been conducted on you and to request a copy of the report. These reports will be conducted by the City of Plymouth or its partners (e.g., Verified Credentials).

In connection with your employment or your application for employment, the City of Plymouth may also generate an investigative consumer report on you or it may request an investigative consumer report about you from a third party consumer reporting agency. An "investigative consumer report" is a background report that includes information from personal interviews. The most common form of an investigative consumer report in connection with employment is a reference check through personal interviews with sources such as your former employers and associates, and other information sources. The investigative consumer report may contain information concerning your character, general reputation, personal characteristics, mode of living, or credit standing. You may request more information about the nature and scope of an investigative consumer report by contacting Human Resources.

The scope of this disclosure is all-encompassing and allows the City of Plymouth to obtain from any outside organization all manner of consumer reports or investigative consumer reports during the application process and throughout the course of your employment.

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Child Protection Background Check Act Consent Form (cont'd)

As the subject of a children's service worker background check, you have the right to:

- be informed that the city will request this check for becoming or continuing as an employee or volunteer
- be informed of the results of the background check and to get a copy of the background check report
- obtain a copy of any record that forms the basis for the report
- challenge the accuracy and completeness of any information contained in the report
- be informed if the city has denies your application or continuation of employment or continuation of volunteering because of the results of the check
- not be required to pay the cost of the background check.

The Data Practices Act requires that we inform you that you do not need to provide this information; however, if the information is not provided, the city will no longer consider your application. Any omission or false representation by you will result in rejection of your application or if hired or enlisted as a volunteer, the termination of your employment or volunteer duties. I authorize the City of Plymouth Human Resources Department to disclose criminal history record information to the hiring department for employment purposes with this agency. The expiration of this authorization shall occur one year from the date of my signature.

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If you are under 18, you must have a parent/guardian sign for you.
