

Cortland Apple

Malus x domestica 'Cortland'



Growth Requirements

- Sun Exposure: Full sun (six to eight hours)
- Soil: neutral pH, well-draining, needs about 1 inch of water every ten days
- Hardiness Zone: 4 to 6
- Mature Height: 15 feet
- Mature Spread: 15 feet
- Growth Rate: Moderate
- Plant spacing: 12 to 15 feet apart

Tree

- Vigorous & Long-Lived Heirloom - 100 Years in Cultivation
- A cultivar of Ben Davis and McIntosh Apple trees

- Green summer foliage with yellow fall color

Flowers

- Self-fertile but higher yields with a Pollinator Buddy
- Pollination Buddy: Consider Lodi, Gala, Granny Smith
- Flower: Mid-May, white blooms
- Pollinators adore this variety.

Fruit

- Red fruit with yellow highlights
- Flavorful yet tart, white flesh
- Great fresh eating apple
- Doesn't brown fast.
- Take 2 to 5 years to produce fruit.
- Harvest in September
