
How does recycling work in Plymouth?

Commodity	Recycled Into
#1 PET	Pop Bottles, Textiles, padding, insulation and bags
#2 HDPE	Bottles for non-food items like Shampoo, laundry detergent, motor oil. Plastic lumber and furniture, piping, recycling bins, fencing,floor tiles, buckets, crates, flowerpots, garden edging, film and sheeting
#5 PP	Brooms, brushes, bins, pallets, auto battery cases and flowerpots
Cardboard (OCC)	Linerboard for Cardboard Boxes
Mixed Paper	Cereal and Pop/Beer Boxes
Aluminum	Aluminum Cans, Aluminum Sheeting for Planes and Automobiles
Tin Cans	Steel Beams
Glass	Containers, Fiberglass, Highway Beads, Glass Abrasives

Cardboard	LDI Becker, MN	Brown (Kraft) paper
Cardboard and Mixed Paper	West Rock St. Paul, MN	Liner Board
Glass	Strategic St. Paul, MN	Glass Bottles and Food Containers
Steel Cans	AMG St. Paul, MN	Turned into steel much of which was used on the new 35W bridge after the collapse
