



# Do I Have Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)?



STEP 1	<p><b>I think my ash tree may be infested with Emerald Ash Borer.</b></p> <p>→ <i>Go to step #3</i></p>	 
STEP 2	<p><b>I suspect I have seen an Emerald Ash Borer.</b></p> <p>→ <i>Go to step #5</i></p>
